Edit Aquarian, NLC received her Master's of Science in Conflict Resolution and PeaceBuilding from California State University, Dominguez Hill in 2014 and a double Bachelors of Arts from Chaminade University in 2010. Prior to working at Pura Vida Healthcare, she was self-employed at Durango NVC Services as a communication skill trainer, counselor, coach, mediator from 2013. She is the founder, project director and psychotherapist for Veterans Homestead Project, a Colorado based nonprofit organization serving disabled combat veterans suffering from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder and Traumatic Brain Injury since 2014. Mrs Aquarian worked at Hawaii NVC Services from 2009 thru 2014 as owner/counselor. Mrs. Aquarian has 18 years of experience working with clientele in a variety of settings including: pre-school, elementary school teacher in Montessori education, leading a pilot program to bring Nonviolent Communication based conflict resolution systems to Montessori schools on Maui, HI. She has also worked extensively in the family court as a mediator and family therapist practicing her unique approach of whole family restorative work. She has simultaneously offered parenting classes, and communication skills trainings to professionals, school groups, educators and small businesses. Mrs. Aquarian has co-lead trainings in NVC and Restorative Justice Circles to incoming mediators at Mediation Services of Maui. She was the founder and leader for Hawaii NVC Nonprofit Organization from 2003 to 2009. Mrs. Aquarian specializes in clientele that struggle with family conflict, divorce, mediation, PTSD, TBI, anxiety, depression, eating disorders, trauma, addictions, and personal empowerment.

2. The regulatory requirements applicable to mental health professionals are as follows:

- If the professional is a registered psychotherapist, the psychotherapist is listed in the State's database and is authorized by law to practice psychotherapy in Colorado, but is not licensed by the State and is not required to satisfy any standardized educational or testing requirements to obtain registration.
- Certified Addiction Counselor I (CAC I) must be a high school graduate or the equivalent, complete required training hours and 1000 hours of clinically supervised work experience.
- Certified Addiction Counselor II (CAC II) must meet the CAC I requirements, complete additional training hours above the CAC I, and 2000 hours of clinically supervised work experience. Regulatory requirements applicable to mental health professionals continued:
- Certified Addiction Counselor III (CAC III) must have a Bachelor's degree in the behavioral health sciences or field; complete additional training above the CAC II, and 2000 hours of clinically supervised work experience.
- Licensed Addiction Counselor must have a clinical Master's degree, meet the CAC III requirements, and pass a national examination in addiction treatment.
- Licensed Social Worker must hold a master's degree in social work.
- Psychologist Candidate, Marriage and Family Candidate, and a Licensed Professional Counselor Candidate must hold the necessary licensing degree and be in the process of completing the required supervision for licensure.
- Licensed Clinical Social Worker, Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist, and a

Licensed Professional Counselor must hold a master's degree in their profession and have two years of post-masters supervision.

- Licensed Psychologist must hold a doctorate degree in psychology and have one year of post-doctoral supervision.

3. You are entitled to receive information from your therapist about the methods of therapy, the techniques used, the duration of your therapy (if known) and the fee structure. You can seek a second opinion from another therapist or terminate therapy at any time. In a professional relationship, sexual intimacy is never appropriate and should be reported to the Board that registers, certifies or licenses the registrant, certificate holder or licensee.

4. Generally speaking, the information provided by and to the client during therapy sessions is legally confidential and cannot be released without the client's consent. There are exceptions to this confidentiality, some of which are listed in Section 12-43-218 of the Colorado Revised Statutes as well as other exceptions in Colorado and federal law. For example, mental health professionals are required to report child abuse to authorities. If a legal exception to confidentiality arises during therapy, if feasible, you will be informed accordingly.

5. I understand that my alcohol and/or drug treatment records are protected under the Federal Confidentiality Regulation, 42 C. F. R., Part 2, governing Confidentiality of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Patient Records. Confidential information cannot be disclosed without my written permission unless otherwise provided for by the regulations. Exceptions to confidentiality may also be found in the Notice of Privacy Rights you were provided.

6. I have read the preceding information, it has been provided to me verbally, and I understand my rights as a patient or as the patient's responsible party.
